Hear

- * Hear your child. Listen.
 - * Ask him about his hopes and dreams.
 - * Ask her about her worries and concerns.
 - * Ask him what he would like to learn and do.
- * Hear what God tells you about what your child needs and what your child needs you to do. Listen.
- * Ask and listen through weekly mentor meetings with your child.

See

- * See the vision God has for your family. Your Family Mission.
- * See your child as God sees him.
- * See your child's gifts and strengths.
- * See your child's weaknesses.
- * See how her weaknesses can be made into strengths.
- * See your child's potential and personal mission.
- * See connections in everything you learn and do.
- * "See Jane read." Read classics, not textbooks. Discuss.

Think

- * Write down your thoughts-God's inspiration regarding what you need to do and what your child needs to do.
- * Find out what the experts think. Study and apply as inspired.

- * Remember you are the expert. Trust yourself to hear, see, and do what matters most for your child.
- * Think you can.

Say

- * Say everything with a smile.
- * Say something nice or don't say anything at all.
- * Say "I'm sorry."
- * Say "I forgive you."
- * Say "I love you."
- * Increase your praise and your appreciation and your children will exceed your expectations.

Go

- * Go places. Explore. Be a traveler-at home and abroad. Expose your family to greatness. Interests stem from exposure.
- * Go up to the mountains. Go down to the streams. Go into the garden. The world is your classroom.
- * Go find someone to teach you something today.
 - * Connect with local home schoolers online or in children's classes, at conventions and seminars.
 - * Mentors, Not Professors.

Be

- * Be there. Be together. Be with them.
- * Be a mentor.
 - * Be a coach, a facilitator, a leader, a manager, an advocate, a guide.
- * Be yourself.
 - * You are your child's parent. Teach them and love them as only a parent can do.
 - * Don't imitate. Create!

Do

- * Do what you love.
- * Do what your children love.
- * Do what you are inspired to do, not what you feel you are required to do.
- * Do it yourself. Read, write, study, learn, take a class, seek a mentor. You, Not Them.
- * Do hard things.
- * "Be strong and of good courage, and do it." (I Chron. 28:20)

- * Feel joy and peace as you learn and grow as a family.

 Remember you are learning and living heaven.
- * Feel confident because you are not alone.
- * Feel secure, not stressed.
- * Feel the simplicity, not the complexity.
- * Feel inspired.
- * Feel the love of learning.

Become
